

Maria Magdalena Llabre received her PhD in educational research from the University of Florida in 1978. She is Professor of Psychology and Education and a Cooper Fellow in the College of Arts and Sciences, University of Miami. She is Director of Biobehavioral Statistics at the Behavioral Medicine Research Center, Department of Psychology, where she has worked collaboratively for over 35 years in research studies in the field of cardiovascular behavioral medicine. She also has over 45 years of experience teaching and supervising graduate students in data analysis and consulting with applied researchers. Dr. Llabre was the Associate Chair and Director of Graduate Studies in the Department of Psychology in 2014-2021. She is a fellow of the Academy of Behavioral Medicine Research (ABMR), the Society of Behavioral Medicine, and Society for Health Psychology (Division 38 of the American Psychological Association). In 2022 she received the lifetime service award from the ABMR. Dr. Llabre joined APS in 2004 and served on the executive council in 2011-2014. She was the statistics editor for Psychosomatic Medicine from 2005-2015. For the past 15 years, Dr. Llabre has studied Hispanic health and is co-PI of the Miami Field Center of the NIH NHLBI longitudinal, multi-center Hispanic Community Health Study/Study of Latinos (HCHS/SOL). Her current work tries to understand the Hispanic paradox, the observation that Hispanics in the US have lower rates of cardiovascular disease and mortality, despite having a higher risk factor profile.
